

Like it or not plumbers are health workers and possibly the most important health workers in our community as without safe, regulated plumbing practices where would we be?

Those of us who have travelled to third world countries have experienced what it is like to be exposed to unsafe drinking water and poor sanitation and the number of water borne diseases and viruses are increasing around the world. As recent as 2003 the SARS virus quickly spread around the world as a result of poor plumbing installations in Hong Kong. Other viruses such as Dengue Fever, Ross River Virus

and Cryptosporidium are all potential killers. An alarming fact is that 80% of gastroenteritis viruses emanate from poor quality water.

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



The Government's building industry reforms overhaul current legislation that has often been burdened with delays, outdated laws and cumbersome dispute resolution for over 50 years.

The new framework integrates building practitioner licensing, building standards and building complaints into a single organisation, the Building Commission, and comes into effect from 1 July this year.

This will modernise Western Australia's building industry to create a fair and innovative environment for builders and consumers, while providing a range of modern services to



fast-track building applications and reduce red tape. The plumbing industry and licensed plumbers in particular, will play an important role in creating and maintaining stable and quality services that are good for business, customers and the environment.

Within our evolving building industry generally, plumbers in particular are benefiting by developing technology which now allows them to book a drainage audit with the Plumbers Licensing Board by simply sending an SMS or an email.

The plumbing industry is embracing this modern communications technology to make it easier for plumbers to comply with Western Australia's high water safety standards.

To take advantage of this new system, SMS 0417 209 818 or email plumbingaudits@commerce.wa.gov.au with the normally required information and you will get a response back by the method of communication you use.

The Plumbers Licensing Board Newsletter, published in partnership with the Building Commission, is a good vehicle to communicate technical, regulatory and industry information. As part of the ongoing process to improve building and plumbing support services to industry, this newsletter is earmarked for quarterly publication and I welcome any input you would like to provide. Gas industry sponsors will also accompanying the EnergySafety gas inspectors to make these events worthwhile attending.


## **Gas meter locations**

## Openings into a building above a gas meter box

A gas fitter/plumber at the Gas Industry Roadshow in Bunbury queried the distance a window is to be above a gas meter box. There is no mention of this in Australian Standards, AS/NZS5601. 2010 gas installations.

The reference to this is: The Gas Distribution Networks AS/NZS 4645. 2008 Part 1: Network Management, Appendix K figure (1) requires an opening into a building to be greater than 1000mm above the gas service regulators relief vent contained in the gas meter box (see diagram below).

Gas service regulators are now required to have an internal relief. In the unlikely event that the relief valve discharges gas to atmosphere, there is a possibility of gas entering a building if an opening is less than that as detailed in this code.

## Working with the Water Corporation – the Plumbing Handbook

Following consultation with representatives from the plumbing and building industries the Water Corporation has prepared and published the: Plumbing Handbook – A guide for working with the Water Corporation.



The handbook fills the gap between plumbing standards, regulations and the Corporation's servicing requirements. It contains information ranging from disconnection and connection of services, to backflow prevention, electrical risks and legal requirements.

It's important to note that the Corporation's policies on backflow prevention and sewer maintenance have recently been updated. Additional information is contained within the plumbing handbook.

Over many years the existing sewer maintenance policy has been misinterpreted, so with the publication of the new handbook the Water Corporation is defining the responsibilities as they are found in Section 63 of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act 1909.

As per the diagram, the internal property sewer (property connection) is shown as being all the way from the building to the sewer junction and is the responsibility of the owner/occupier to keep clean and clear. Previously plumbing companies have called the Water Corporation to clear a sewer blockage when they have rodded down the inspection shaft to a depth of just 2.5metres.

When the Water Corporation is called to clear a sewer blockage and finds that the manholes are running clear, no reimbursement is made



for the plumber's callout fee. There will also be no reimbursement of a callout fee where the Water Corporation is able to clear the blockage in the property connection by plunging from the inspection shaft. The property connection is the responsibility of the owner/occupier and as such should be cleared by the plumber engaged to do the work and the customer billed for the work.

If the Water Corporation determines that excavation is required to repair the sewer property connection, the Corporation will assume responsibility for the repair if:

- the depth of the required excavation is 2.5 meters or more; and/or
- excavation is required outside the property.

With the great working relationship between the Water Corporation and the plumbing industry, the Corporation is hoping to get this message out to as many as possible so that plumbing contractors better understand the



responsibilities of the sewer maintenance policy and not find themselves out of pocket. When the Corporation is called on 131375 to clear a blockage, it expects that no costs will be borne by the property owner.

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

Sadly 2011 marks the first year to which Roger has not renewed his Licence since 1959 due to ill health. Roger has seen many changes with this industry over the years...

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

imagine only being paid \$8 per week - \$6 of which went to your mum for board! Roger recollects at the time you could earn \$15 a week more to make milkshakes at the local milk bar! Apprenticeships consisted of a 5 year term when Roger started out, which predominately was spent doing hard labour on top of two nights a week of night school and one day a fortnight of tech college. None of which, unlike today, focussed on the operating section of operating a business. This was one of the issues that Roger came up against when starting his own business in Jurien, the lack of business knowledge left him with loses of thousands of dollars with many unpaid invoices and bounced cheques over the years.

It takes a lot of personalities to make the plumbing industry in WA what it is.

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## Saving a life or chatting with the PM... All in a days work for Callum Eiffler

Callum Eiffler's time as an MPA Skills Apprentice Employment apprentice has been far from mundane.

In August 2009, and only just into his second year, Callum was working with highly respected and valued host employer Lupica Plumbing and Drainage. The former John Forrest Senior High School Pre Apprentice called on his natural instincts when his supervising tradesman, Mick Head, collapsed on the floor of a job they were working on.

Initially the eighteen year old thought Mick was fooling about but when he noticed blood pouring from his nose he rolled him into the 'coma position' and covered him with a tarp to keep him dry from the falling rain. Callum then called for an ambulance and the fire brigade.

Mick was diagnosed as a brain aneurism. His Grade 4 bleed from the Basal artery was severe and Mick was given a 5% chance of surviving.

"There's no question that Callum's instincts and quick reactions had a huge influence on where I am today," Mick said recently. "For a kid to do what he so quickly – it's amazing. There was only so much time available before permanent damage is unavoidable."

Mick's recovery in itself has been amazing. He was back on light duties within six months and is now back to four days a week.

"Ben Lupica has been a terrific boss helping with work through this period. Callum and I work together and he's got such a great work ethic - I'm lucky," Mick added.

As a graduate of the JFSH School Based Pre Apprenticeship inaugural course in 2007, Callum was fortunate enough to be invited to the official opening of the school's award winning trade centre in March.

Along with fellow graduates Anton Anteric (Falcetta Plumbing and Gas) and Reece Hocking (Sanwell), Callum had the opportunity to impress Prime Minister Julia Gillard, Minister for School Education Peter Garrett and Federal Member for Perth Steven Smith with their skills and appreciation of the opportunity the course has provided them in establishing a career.



## The why and what of financial year end record keeping for small business

In today's day and age, small businesses continue to feel the heat of delivering on every day customer needs with little time left over to do anything else. End of Financial Year End adds a whole new set of pressures to the small business owner in the form of getting their financial records up to date. Get it wrong and the penalties can be stiff, but get it right and the benefits can be immense.

## WHY KEEP GOOD RECORDS?

The mere mention of the phrase 'record keeping' is enough to bring on an immediate and sever migraine. So what's the big deal, why should keeping good financial records be something that hits my radar?

### 1. Hands on the Steering Wheel

Having proper financial records ensures you know where your business is at, where it is going and what pitfalls or opportunities may be coming up.

### 2. The Government Stick

By law, the ATO requires you to keep certain business records and big penalties apply if you do not comply. You are required to keep financial records for a minimum of five years.

**3.** Bang for your Buck – maintaining good financial records means easier and faster completion of BAS and other tax obligations when they are due. Additionally, good financial record keeping gives you the best chance of maximizing your refund come Tax Time.

## WHAT ARE YOUR RECORD KEEPING OBLIGATIONS?

ATO requires businesses to maintain certain business records for tax purposes. To small business this list can seem both daunting and confusing. So to keep it simple here is a 'Top 3' that should provide some Year End clarity

1. What goes into your Income Tax and GST Returns must be kept

- Sales records e.g. sales invoices, credit card statements, bank deposit books

- Purchase records e.g. tax invoices, bank account and credit card statements
- Year-end income tax records e.g. vehicle expenses, stock-take sheets, depreciation schedules

2. Employing Staff comes with record keeping obligations such as TFN declarations, worker payment records, PAYG payment summaries, and superannuation and FBT details.

3. Do you have suppliers who do not quote an ABN Number? If so then you will need to keep records of amounts withheld from supplier payments, PAYG withholding voluntary agreements, Payment summaries and annual reports.

## **TOOLS TO HELP**

The ATO provides some great tools (they actually do!). Here's 2 favourites regarding records you need to keep:

1. A great guide: "Record keeping for small business". Everything you need to know in one brochure. Go the ATO website www.ato.gov. au and type in "NAT3029" and it will take you straight to the guide. It's worth reading before June 30.

2. Online evaluation tool: What records do you need to keep? ATO provides an online tool that takes 15 minutes to complete and provides small business with a great snapshot of the records they need to keep for year end. ## DO'S

- Comply with the ATO requirements in full – you will have peace of mind and if you ever want to sell your business, potential buyers will have more confidence.
- Stay organised get records into files and a system that works for you. Make it routine so you don't get swamped at tax time. See if your accountant can help here.
- Keep your fuel receipts if you intend to claim fuel tax credits speak to your accountant about the best method for you.

## DONT'S!


- Don't put it off. You can't, so just find the tools and the system that works for you or ask your accountant for guidance.
- Don't throw away potentially important records. If in doubt keep it it's no big deal.
- Mix up your business and personal records. Keep them separate and save a headache later.

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



# **Managing Work Trauma**

Did you see the images of destruction in the recent Queensland, Victorian and Japanese disasters? Seeing the grief on the faces of those who lost family, livestock and homes as well as their struggles for food, power and water was difficult. Equally tragic are the results of traumatic building incidents. WACIRF (Western Australian Construction Industry Redundancy Fund) employs a psychologist, Sergio Del Borrello, to deal with these incidents and he provides tips on managing them.

#### When does it occur?

- Use of plant leading to impact, electrocution, amputation, burns, crushing etc.
- · Falls from a height, trips and slips
- Work vehicle, plane, train, or shipping accidents
- Natural disasters cyclone (remember Cyclone George in 2007?), floods and bushfires

**How common is it?** Worksafe figures indicate that the number of lost time injuries (LTI's) in building have been increasing; closing 2008-09 at a five year high and above the average.

- On average a person is killed in WA every 19 days due to a traumatic work-related incident
- Nine traumatic work-related fatalities were recorded in WA during 2009-10

#### How do I handle an emergency?

- Act calmly while assessing the scene
- Ensure safety for yourself and others
- Provide first aid to casualties
- Contact emergency services
- Gather and share important information
- Arrange for immediate workforce psychological assessment via WACIRF

#### After the emergency

- Monitor stress levels and recovery of the work group
- Keep the work group fully informed on the welfare of casualties

We don't often think about what happens after a trauma. Things may seem to go back to normal, but only while cleaning up, correcting unsafe conditions and making reports do we consider what more we could have done. The more serious the trauma, the more we think about it.

When this thinking goes on for weeks and affects day to day functioning,

professional help is required. It needs to be dealt with as it can affect relationships, concentration and peace of mind.

These stress reactions can occur in those who experience or watch traumas and may develop into Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).

Evidence suggests early detection of stressed workers and referral for help can decrease LTI's, the severity of symptoms and overall suffering.

The Australian Centre for Post Traumatic Mental Health suggest around 5% of the population will experience PTSD. Acute PTSD symptoms can last from 1 – 3 months; chronic symptoms can last from 3 months to years.

Employers insure against trauma and complications arising from LTI's by contracting in support services to provide counselling and debrief workers.

What signs of stress do I look for?

#### WORK

- Not attending or anxious about work
- Loss of motivation
- Increases in work hours or effort, at times to cover troubling emotions or so they are too exhausted to think about anything

#### HABITS

- Self Medication Alcohol, cigarettes and marijuana are used to reduce anxiety, get to sleep and 'forget' worries. But the issue is still there in the morning! Using drugs doesn't change the symptoms, it only masks them.
- Less interest in usual activities
- Avoiding places, people or things that remind them of the incident

#### SOCIAL

- Isolates from others
- Easily irritated by small and petty issues
- Seems disinterested in others



#### How can I help?

- Don't ignore the person
- Don't give workers complex work, dangerous equipment or situations requiring concentration
- Don't try to console or give advice e.g. "you'll get over it", "pull yourself together", "forget about it" or "it gets better with time". This makes things worse as workers will see you don't understand what they are going through.
- Do spend time with them and ask them how they are
- Do offer support or to listen, even if they don't ask for help
- Do recognise most men feel weak when reacting emotionally – reassure them it is not a weakness but indicates strength of character

If your company is a WACIRF member, you are eligible for free expert help to deal with work trauma, as well as journey accident, ambulance and funeral cover. ## Q.What is a tempering valve?

ANSWER: A tempering valve is a device that can deliver a blend of hot and cold water mixed to a constant temperature. Inside the device is a temperature sensitive element that expands and contracts depending on the temperature of the water flow across it. The elements action will move a piston between the hot and cold ports inside the device. This allows the device to maintain a constant temperature at the outlet of the device.

## Q. When to temper and when not to temper hot water lines Domestic?

Exerts from current PLB Tech Notes March 2010

#### **New installations**

(1)For **new installations** heated water shall be tempered to 50°C to prevent scalding at the outlets of sanitary fixtures used primarily for personal hygiene (basins, baths and showers).

(2)For **specialised facilities** a temperature limit of 45°C using a Thermostatic Mixing Valve is required at the outlet of all sanitary fixtures used primarily for personal hygiene purposes for early childhood centres, primary and secondary schools, nursing homes or similar facilities. Best Practice Advice for Replacement water heaters

The Board looks to the relevant Licensed Plumbing Contractor to apply his/her technical qualifications and professional judgement to ensure that any heated water installation that is certified under the Regulations presents no risk of injury to customers.

The Board recommends tempering of heated water services wherever there is a risk of scalding. For outlets of sanitary fixtures used primarily for personal hygiene, that temperature should not exceed 50°C (in other than specialised facilities).

Other plumbing work situations that may require a Licensed Plumbing Contractor to

consider tempering include:

• a direct replacement (like for like) of any existing type of water heater;


• the maintenance, repair or replacement of existing heated water pipe work that is covered under the Regulations (A Multi-Entry Compliance Certificate is required for this Minor Plumbing Work); or

• a direct replacement (like for like) of an existing solar water heater where the new solar heater is fitted with one of the following devices:

(i) a thermosiphon arrester;

- (ii) a heat dump valve; or
- (iii) a differential pump controller/high limit cut-out.

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


